Pupil Premium School Improvement Project – Under the leadership of the Principal and TLR3 Removing DisadvantageIntervention Project Leads, there has been close analysis of both national research and local knowledge about what makes a difference to narrowing the attainment gap between students in receipt of Pupil Premium and all students nationally.
