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Dear Parent/Carer,

The Prime Minister has informed us that whilst all of our combined efforts so far do appear to have reduced the R rate, there is no appetite to relax measures too soon. I am sure that we all want children and young people back in school at the earliest possible opportunity but equally we share the anxiety that to do so too soon risks our NHS coming under still greater pressure. Therefore, the government has decided to continue to limit school attendance to help to support the reduction in the overall number of social contacts in our communities. This they tell us is a vital intervention in the context of current high prevalence of Covid-19. Until 8 March at the earliest, all schools remain open only for vulnerable children and children of critical keyworkers. All other pupils and students should not attend and should learn remotely. I miss them all and look forward to welcoming them back as soon as we are allowed to do so.
