This will enable me to take the required action as soon as I am alerted and put the necessary protocols in place for the remainder of your child's bubble. Please note this number must only be used in the event of a positive result being confirmed.

On a further health and safety note, we have been advised of a trend in the purchase of self-piercing appliances. We are concerned over the potential health and hygiene risks over these appliances and would advise that ear piercings should only be undertaken by qualified practitioners. May I also remind you that students are only allowed to wear a single piercing in each ear lobe as per our uniform policy. Our staff will continue to uphold our uniform standards, and we appreciate your support in ensuring students attend school in full uniform, with any accessorising being in line with our uniform policy.
