Dear Students, Parents and Carers,

June the 18th has been a key date in the school calendar this year as it represents the day in which all Teacher Assessed Grades must be submitted to our Examination Boards. I would like to pay tribute today not only to the students that have engaged with the process so well over the last few months, but also the staff within our school. I cannot emphasise enough how proud I am of the Newent team who have undertaken this task with exceptional care, diligence and professionalism to ensure our students receive objective and fair grades this Summer. The additional workload and weight of responsibility that has been placed upon school staff all over the country cannot be underestimated. My sincere thanks to all involved in the process.

As has become fairly routine over the last year, Monday's announcement regarding the delayed easing of lockdown measures across the country has required us to revisit our plans for a number of events planned for over the next few weeks. Throughout the Covid pandemic we have been forced to make difficult decisions based upon evolving information and have always placed the wellbeing of our school community at the heart of our decision making processes. Unfortunately, in the same manner as my predecessor in this role, I must again ask that all members of our school community seek resolution on any concerns they may have directly with the school, and allow an appropriate period for a response to be provided, prior to posting commentary on social media sites.

One of the measures that we have put in place within the school to support continued attendance is our involvement in the Daily Contact Testing Clinical Trial. Please find below a message from the Clinical Trial Team.

As we are coming into our 9th week and drawing ever closer to completing the trial, I wanted to emphasise again how essential the element of data is to the success or failure of the trial that we have been taking part in. Data comes in the form of twice-weekly PCR tests being returned, parent surveys about testing at home, questionnaires about the trial, Positive case incidences and so on.
