Anti-Bullying Week- 15th November

Anti-Bullying Week is an annual UK event, held in the third week in November which aims to raise awareness of bullying of children and young people, in schools and elsewhere, and to highlight ways of preventing and responding to it. It started in 2002 and has since grown to become a significant event in the calendars of children, families and schools. As a school we are committed to the culture that bullying of any form is not tolerated, and where it occurs, it is dealt with swiftly and effectively. The key principles and values underpinning this intent is that all staff and students have a right to feel safe and secure within our community, and that we meet the expectations of other stakeholders, including parents and carers, in ensuring that the school effectively deals with bullying situations. If any student, parer or carer has a concern in this area I would ask that they contact the school directly via admin@newent.gloucs.sch.uk so that the issues can be addressed and resolved.

We will be holding assemblies and information sessions during next week and students are all encouraged to take part in the 'Wear Odd Socks Day' on Monday 15th November to raise awareness of the cause.

In relation to our commitment to not tolerate bullying or harassment of any sort I am sorry to have to write to students, parents and carers with a clear warning regarding the appropriate use of social media. As you may have seen in the news this week schools across the country are experiencing situations where students have impersonated school social media accounts

and created videos containing harmful and defamatory comments directed at school staff. Disappointingly, this has also been the case in our school community this week. I would like to make the message very clear that behaviour such as this will absolutely not be tolerated within our school and any incidents will be investigated thoroughly with severe sanctions issued for any students involved. We will also report incidents to the Police for support in this area.

I am deeply saddened to have to share a message such as this and I would ask parents and carers to support this message and ensure that your children are aware of the appropriate use of social media, and the potential damaging consequences of inappropriate usage. Catering Update

Could we remind parents and carers that Meet n Eat is completely cashless with all purchases being made using the student's fob. While we appreciate that fobs can be misplaced or forgotten on a day, we will speak with any student who is regularly forgetting to use their fob. I would request that parents and carers support the team in maintaining the cashless systems.

Allergy information is available for all items on sale. It is, however, important that you make sure the school is aware of any food allergies your child has. It is still important that your child understands their allergies and understands their responsibility in checking the allergy content of food they are buying, however, Chef will support all students who have a particular allergy and wishes to eat in Meet n Eat. For example, Chef regularly purchases gluten-free bread for those students who wish to eat a sandwich. All we ask is that the item is preordered and paid for in advance.

We have received a number of requests from parents and carers to use Halal meat. This is something Chef can accommodate through the preordering system.
