COVID 19 testing on return to school on Thursday January 6th 2022

As mentioned in my previous letters, the Government has told secondary schools to test students for Covid onsite when they return after the Christmas holidays in January. We will again establish our on-site testing systems for the first days back after break. All other current control measure within school will still be in place in January. We will again update our school Risk Assessments and Contingency Plans over the school break in light of any updated guidance that is released by the Government. I will write to all students, parents and carers prior to the start of term with the most recent updates.

Winter safety

Again, I would ask that parents and carers make sure that children can be seen at this time of year, especially on the way to and from school – journeys that they may make in the dark or twilight. The most common time for child pedestrians to be involved in a road accident is mornings or afternoons on weekdays in the winter. We recommend that children wear or carry something to make them more visible. As a rule, this should be something bright or fluorescent during the day and something reflective at dusk and in the dark (fluorescent clothing is not so visible in the dark) - "be bright be seen". I would also ask that parents and carers of students that travel on school and public buses remind their children of the essential aspects of Road Safety when departing their buses.
