| Assessment Method | The course is equivalent in size to one A Level. 4 units are covered over the two years of which 3 are mandatory. 2 units are externally assessed and 2 assignment units are internally assessed and externally verified. The assessment process includes a range of methods including examinations, set tasks which provide students with work-based challenges in timed, realistic work conditions. | | |
| Career Pathway | This course provides students with foundational knowledge of a range of aspects linked to the field of Health & Social Care work. It is recognised by higher education establishments, especially for nursing, early years & child development, psychology, nutrition, care, social studies and health. The Health and Social Care Sector is one of the UK's largest employers, and therefore this course can be a stepping stone for a wide range of employment opportunities. The qualification complements other A Level subjects such as Biology, Sociology, Psychology and Food Science and Nutrition.
