

### **Anti-Bullying Charter**

This term, we have been looking at how we manage our relationships and our use of language when defining negative experiences. One term that is often mis-identified is 'bullying'. During house assemblies, all students have been introduced to our new support materials which have been designed to help them assess their interactions and communicate about the situation effectively. Our whole staff team also have access to these materials so that we can be consistent in our use of language. We have outlined the support that students can access and what to expect when reporting negative peer interactions. Please find the key documents included below, including a <u>definition of bullying</u>. Please do have a look at these with your young person/people and discuss it.

As part of this new guidance, we are also launching an <u>Accountability badge</u> that can be earned by meeting the key principles underpinning the new managing relationships guidance. All students will be given a card by their tutor which will allow them to evidence their work towards the badge and a completed card handed in to Miss. Harvey before the end of term will secure a badge being awarded.

Finally, we are launching our new <u>Anti-bullying charter</u>, which will be displayed prominently in tutorial spaces and throughout the school.



#### Year 10 History students meet a Medieval Barber Surgeon

Last Friday we were delighted to welcome John Putley from Gloucestershire Archives, who gives historical talks to schools as part of their outreach service.

The barber surgeon, one of the most common European <u>medical practitioners</u> of the <u>Middle Ages</u>, was generally charged with caring for soldiers during and after battle. In this era, <u>surgery</u> was seldom conducted by physicians, but instead by <u>barbers</u>, who, possessing <u>razors</u> and dexterity indispensable to their trade, were called upon for numerous tasks ranging from cutting hair to pulling teeth to amputating limbs. In this period, surgical mortality was very high due to blood loss, shock and infection. Yet, since doctors thought that <u>bloodletting</u> to balance 'humours' (liquids in the body) would improve health, barbers also used bloodletting razors and applied <u>leeches</u>. The red and white poles displayed outside barber shops today is a reminder of their gruesome trade - blood and bandages!

John gave our students a 45-minute demonstration of the "tools of the trade", with many examples of incidents that had not gone so well.
