#### Year 9 Camp

Last week 115 students visited Mendip Base Camp Activity Centre in Somerset for our annual year 9 Camp. The weather was very kind to us and we enjoyed sun-filled days under canvas in beautiful surroundings. Activities were designed to aid team work, co-operation and communication and some of the challenges were pretty tough. The groups worked together to puzzle out how to defuse bombs, clear mines and cross lava fields (metaphorical bombs, mines and lava!)

The extensive grounds allowed students to brush up their map-reading skills on an orienteering course and their target accuracy by playing frisbee golf in stunning flower meadows and woodland.

Students got to try their hand at some bush craft activities including building shelters (which needed to protect them from buckets of water) and fire lighting. Some were more successful than others!

Evening activities included wide games and campfires and we finished the camps with some combat archery which got pretty competitive, especially between the staff.

I would like to thank all of the students for their energy and enthusiasm at camp and the accompanying staff for ensuring that our year 9's had the opportunity to make some new memories outdoors to round off their school year.

### **Free School Meal Voucher Scheme**

We would like to make you aware of the holiday Free School Meal (FSM) voucher scheme that Gloucestershire County Council is currently offering to families in Gloucestershire.

The holiday vouchers are designed to support the families of eligible children in reception to year 11 who receive Pupil Premium (income-related) free school meals and attend a school in Gloucestershire, where no other support is available.

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Gloucestershire County Council is committed to supporting families with 2 weeks of vouchers at £15 per eligible child, per week for the Summer 2024 holiday.

The other 4 weeks of the holiday are supported through the HAF programme, which provides a meal for children attending the activities they are booked onto. For more information, please visit <u>Gloucestershire HAF</u> where you can also sign up to the Children's Activities Booking System (CABS). The HAF programme is a separate scheme, and vouchers cannot be issued as an alternative.

Applications for holiday FSM vouchers for Summer 2024 holiday will be open until midday on 09 July 2024. We will be unable to accept any applications after this date. Vouchers will be distributed to families the week commencing 15 July 2024.

Please note we check eligibility for the scheme by cross-referencing with the term-time free school meal register, so please make sure you have registered the child beforehand.

Those who have signed up previously do not need to re-register.

### **History Trips**

#### Year 7 visit 17th Century Gloucester

Our current Year 7 are studying the English Civil Wars of 1642-1651, and the walled City of Gloucester was a major flashpoint in 1643. King Charles I had secured the whole of the South West of England, except for Gloucester, where the forces of Parliament chose to make a stand. Our guides from the Civic Trust took five groups of students around the perimeter (shown in red on the image), of what would have been the city walls at the time, with plenty of entertaining stories being told at key locations. All of the students represented themselves and the school very well, and I



would like to thank them for their excellent attitude and behaviour. My thanks also go to the other school staff involved - Mr Walsh, Mr Brown and Miss Smith.
