SALT DOUGH CHALLANGE

Salt dough is cheep and easy to make. Have a play with the dough and see what you can make. Then challenge yourself to make something that will communicate an aspect of your personality. All work submitted can be included I your Year 12 folio.

Recipe

- 2 x measure of plain flour
- 1 x measure of salt
- 1 x measure of water

Mix the flour and slat together then add water gradually while mixing to form a smooth and robust dough. Many people suggest backing for many hours at a low temperature but the dough will dry out nice and hard over time in the air.

If working on a larger object it is advisable to work over a former. This can be a found object wrapped in cling film or could be made using newspaper and tape to bind.

Once completely dry it can be painted or varnished.
