Year 11 into Year 12 French Summer Assignments

Here are some suggestions for tasks to do over the summer to prepare for studying French in Year 12.

- 1. **Write a diary**. Aim to write something for at least three days each week, where posssible. As well as practising the past tense by writing about what you have done, make a list of which reading tasks and videos you have looked at.
- 2. **Start an A level vocab book.** Get into the habit of looking up new words when you see them and noting them down. Then get into a routine of learning them.
- 3. Do some **private study of verb patterns** (sometimes called verb conjugation). We recommend you buy the book "Practice in French Grammar" by Michael Gross, currently available second hand for 33p + P & P on Amazon. Write out the full pattern of étudier, rester, être, avoir, aller, faire pouvoir and devoir in the following tenses & do the relevant exercises from the grammar book (there is an index at the back):
 - Present tense
 - Perfect tense
 - Imperfect tense
 - Aller + infinitive
 - Future tense
- 4. Spend time reading using some French websites eg https://french.kwiziq.com/learn/reading or the app "Give me 5" which is aimed at French sixth formers. See how much you can work out. This site suggests lots of sites to explore for reading & other practice: https://www.frenchteacher.net/links/interactive-sites/
- 5. Watch some **French films or TV programmes** on Netflix, on other streaming platforms or on DVD. We recommend the series *Lupin* and *Call my Agent* on Netflix. Put the settings onto French with English subtitles. Film recommendations include *Amélie, Bienvenue Chez les Ch'tis, La Famille Belier* & *Les Intouchables* (I think this is currently on Netflix). The film that we will study is called **Entre les murs** (*The Class* in

English), it would be great to buy the DVD of this to watch it in advance; you can get a copy for under a £1 + postage secondhand on Amazon.

- 6. Sign up to the site https://www.ilini.com/learn-french You only need an email address. It has lots of videos and you can choose to have subtitles in English, in French or both. Some videos are behind a paywall but plenty of good ones are not.
