Geography Field Trip

Last Monday, as part of their GCSE exam preparation, Year 10 Geographers went on a fieldtrip to the Forest of Dean. We were dropped off at Wenchford and measured the width, depth, velocity, pebble size and shape of the Blackpool Brook; a tributary of the River Severn. Students observed and collected data in order to test 'Bradshaw's' Theory, which helps describe how a river changes from the upper to the lower course. It really helped students to understand the different processes at work in the real world beyond the textbook. Back at school, they have been describing and analysing the results, ready for questions in the real exam.





Music News

This week will see a range of students taking part in Achievement Evening with musical contributions. We thank those students for their time and commitment to the Music Department and are really looking forward to watching them perform.

Year 5 Taster Day

On Wednesday we welcomed Year 5 students from a range of our feeder primary schools for a taster day. Students experienced lessons in Art, Science, DT, PE, Music and more. They represented their current schools brilliantly and we had such a great time with them. We do hope they will choose Newent.

During this event, our Prefect team really shone. They role modelled our standards and HEART values and provided invaluable support to the Year 5 students. No request was too much trouble. We are really looking forward to thanking them for all of their hard work with our Year 5 and Year 6 days by rewarding them with an early break and treat next Friday at the end of term.







Year 12 Field Trips

The biology and Geography field trip took place this week from Monday to Wednesday. We took the year 12 Biology and Geography students to Aberystwyth.

The biology students' mission was to investigate zonation by measuring the structure and changes of species along a rocky shore. In addition to this we investigated the succession of sand dunes looking at the changes of landscape and species on embryo sandy dunes to semi-fixed dunes. Zonation and succession will be assessed in the A-level biology paper and is also part of a core practical write up which the students need to complete before the end of term. Overall, we had a fun time, despite the rain and worked hard collecting lots of data and looking at all the different marine life on Cardigan Bay.

The Geographers' mission was to spend time investigating the coastal defences; measuring beach profiles, the impacts of longshore drift and erosion to see how effective the groynes and sea wall were. We also looked at the impact of tourism and how important the industry is to the town; students conducted land use surveys, questionnaires and environmental quality surveys. We joined the Biologists on the last day, looking at succession in sand dunes where there are some cross-curricular links.

Both of these investigations have given students the opportunity to run through the different stages of fieldwork: planning methodology data presentation and analysis for either a physical or
