


Message from our Principal








Newent's Biology Week 2024

Green Flag Award 2024 Achieved

Congratulations to pupils who took part in last year's Eco-Committee and Eco- Award activities and the staff that supported them. In particular Grace and Zach whose tenacity ensured the completion of the Award.

The years activities started with an audit of different aspects of the school and the promotion of 'Cut your carbon month'. The committee then chose three of the 10 Action Topics. Litter, biodiversity and global citizenship. Through the year activities took place such as the talk and litter pick with Forest of Dean Community Support Officer which led to much discussion in Eco-Committee about ways that could change problems of litter in school.

Students from G11 took part in a gardening club growing wildflowers and vegetables, while DT club made bug boxes, and learnt about the plight of swifts whilst creating swift boxes. The science pond had a clear out of litter and excess weed to stop it silting up followed by science club carrying out a survey of the ground around the pond and the creatures in the water.



For Global citizenship the poster competition raised understanding of the issues facing the world that affect all of us and how we can all do our part. These will be put up around school. Winners received their prizes in House assemblies alongside pupils receiving certificates for helping with the Green Flag Award.
