ANTI-BULLYING AMBASSADORS

On Tuesday, we took 9 Year 9 students to Hayesfield Girls' School in Bath to undertake Anti-Bullying Ambassador training. Students followed a full day of training focusing on a detailed and balanced development of knowledge and skills:

SESSION ONE: Introduction, aims of the Day, understanding what It means to be an Anti-Bullying Ambassador

Break

SESSION TWO: Exploring what Bullying Behaviour is, the three types of bullying behaviour, the impact how to support your peers

Lunch

SESSION THREE: How to identify bullying behaviour and practical steps to addressing it as an Anti-Bullying Ambassador

Break

SESSION FOUR: Social Action planning, earning badges, next steps

This training is highly sought-after by Secondary Schools, and we have been attempting to get a place for 2 years! This was a very exciting opportunity to finally be involved with. We are now on an ongoing journey with The Diana Award and will keep you updated along the way. Students focused their initial next-step plans on Wellbeing and are looking forward to designing a range of projects to support the Anti-Bullying message and to gain further badges in support. These are similar in nature to the Blue Peter badges and have a particular focus or theme to be met.

Our students conducted themselves absolutely brilliantly throughout the day and were a credit to the school, their families and themselves. They were demonstrating our H.E.A.R.T. Values at all times of the day.

We look forward to taking our newly qualified ambassadors to local primary schools and House Assemblies next term to keep promoting and spreading the word about Anti-Bullying.



Antony & Cleopatra by Newent Community School at The Roses, 12th March 2025 appraised by Holly Meechan

It is my great pleasure to congratulate you, Newent Community School, on your brilliant performance of Antony & Cleopatra as part of Shakespeare Schools Festival this autumn. It was a joy to watch you shine on your performance night, and I'd like to spend some time now highlighting all the aspects of your production that I loved the most.

I loved the clever kitchen theme that you chose for your reimagining of this tale of love and power. The drama in the story translated so well to the world of the restaurant and the great attention to detail, from the 'delivery driver' messenger, to the kitchen utensils used as weapons made it very relatable and even humorous at times.

You had a large cast and used this to your advantage with some excellent ensemble work. This included lots of walk-ons and characters busy in the background of scenes cooking and cleaning, which cleverly reinforced the world of the play. The large battle scene was a particular highlight with everyone on stage together, invested in the action.

You had a great grip of Shakespeare's language, speaking your lines confidently with a clear understanding of what you were saying. I thought you handled wordless moments well too, Eros' death being particularly touching, their body carried away by the ensemble. In a play like Antony and Cleopatra, finding these moments of poignancy and stillness is so important and you handled this like professionals.

The cast were supported by a great technical team, making sure backstage was organised and designing and operating the lights and sound with great professionalism. I really liked the visceral sound effect you chose to use each time a 'sword' was drawn.

We are in awe of all your passion, hard work and creativity! What you have accomplished is something truly special, and we are already looking forward to reimagining Shakespeare with Newent Community School again next year.


