INDIVIDUAL/GROUP MUSIC TUITION

Introduction

Music tuition at Newent Community School and Sixth Form Centre is a private arrangement between parents/carers and the tutor. The School will act as the facilitator for Peripatetic Music Tuition ensuring a relevant space for lessons to take place in, sourcing and undertaking relevant checks on the staff working with our students and monitor the quality of the provision provided, however, you will not have a contract with Newent Community School and Sixth Form Centre.

We will ensure that lesson times are displayed in an easy to access area for students to check and that peripatetic music teachers are regularly reviewed for their suitability to practice. All peripatetic teachers are DBS checked. Newent Community School and Sixth Form Centre will accept no responsibility for payments for lessons. This is arranged between the parent and tutor.

NB: Additional instrumental teachers can be explored upon request. We work closely with local providers to try and ensure all students are able to learn their preferred instrument.

Existing instrumental teachers of students (from Primary school) can book a teaching room to allow continuation of teacher, where preferred. Please ask them to contact the school to discuss.





Termly Fees

Fees are to be paid IN ADVANCE for the term and failure to do so will result in suspension of lessons. Lessons missed by the tutor will be made up at a time convenient for both tutor and student. Any lessons missed by the student without sufficient reason will NOT be reimbursed or made up by the tutor. Any group lesson is by arrangement with the tutor.

Hire of Instruments

Times of Music Lessons

Timetables are arranged on a rotating basis - so that the same lesson is not repeatedly missed each week. However, if you would prefer a regular time, please arrange this directly with your tutor. Tutors will coordinate timetables and these will be emailed to you directly by the tutor and will also be displayed within the subject area in a place convenient for students to see. If a student is taking part in a school event / exam / trip, it is your responsibility to let the teacher know and arrange an alternative time in advance of the day of the lesson taking place.

Further Notes

- 1. You are encouraged to keep in contact with the tutor so that progress can be monitored. Please speak to tutors directly to find out their procedure for progress reporting.
- 2. When the tutor accepts a student for lessons, it is expected that the student will practice for at least 20 minutes a day on that instrument.
- 3. It is usual practice for a tutor to steer the students towards an ABRSM, Trinity College, Guildhall, School of Rock or similar examination course. Should you wish your child to learn purely on a playing for pleasure basis, please contact the tutor so that a suitable programme can be arranged.

Support with Fees:

Make Music Gloucestershire offer a bursary to support fees up to £200 per term (3 term year) for pupils in receipt of pupil premium, or for those families who can demonstrate hardship, to receive individual or small group tuition.

Students could be those playing an instrument, singing or making music using electronic devices. The primary (but not exclusive) aim of the scheme is to support pupils who have received group tuition (usually at primary school through the whole class ensemble tuition scheme) and now require support to progress further.
